



Call for Session Proposals

2013 Global E3 Annual Meeting
Institute of International Education, New York, NY
April 8 – 10, 2013

The Institute of International Education (IIE) is inviting proposals for panel sessions addressing timely topics during the 2013 Global E3 Annual Meeting in New York City. Final Proposals are due by February 1, 2013, by email to ge3@iie.org. Initial concept papers are due by November 15, 2012.

Possible Session/Workshop Topics include (but are not limited to):

- Lessons Learned from experienced Global E3 members
 - On working with students/advisors and on increasing visibility of Global E3 on campus
- How to reduce the impact of budget cuts at institutions on study abroad programs; possible new sources of financial support for study abroad
- Full course credit load for U.S. versus international students. Can students take the full credit load under a tuition swap? How best to advise students on their planned study abroad coursework and course load.
- Establishing programs among/between GE3 members; Examples of successful shorter-term (summer or inter-semester) programs established between Global E3 members, and opened later to all members
- Improvements to the Online Application System; Training on the system.
- Small Group Workshops on:
 - Safety and Security Issues
 - Other suggestions welcome

A key objective of the Annual Meeting is for representatives from member institutions to network and share best practices that can increase the reach of Global E3. Session proposals should not be limited to those listed above. Other topics of general interest that are relevant to the exchange of engineering students and faculty will be given full consideration. Sessions are normally 75 minutes long but will vary depending on the topic and number of speakers. Panelist should include a range of perspectives from several countries if possible.

The 2013 Annual Meeting is being hosted by IIE, located just across from the UN, in the center of Manhattan. IIE will partner with the Polytechnic Institute of New York University to host a half-day site visit and sessions at NYU Poly in Brooklyn, NY. Site visits to other Global E3 member institutions in the NYC area can also be arranged following the meeting.

We encourage interested speakers or panel chairs to submit a brief outline of a proposed meeting session (with some but not necessarily all proposed speakers) by November 15, 2012. Proposals will be reviewed by a conference committee with those of the strongest general interest invited to submit full proposals, including a list of confirmed speakers/panelists, due by February 1, 2013.
