The Annual Meeting will begin with an evening reception on Sunday April 7, 2013 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Millennium UN hotel on 44th Street and 1st Avenue. The Polytechnic Institute of NYU in Brooklyn, New York will host a half-day session as described below. All other sessions will be held at IIE.

Preliminary Meeting Information

Attendees should plan to arrive in New York by Sunday, April 7, 2013 in time to attend the evening reception to welcome all members. Hors d'oeuvres and wine/beer will be served. We anticipate that nearly 60 engineering programs from around the world will be represented at the meeting, with time scheduled for you to develop new partnerships and expand existing ones.

Monday's meeting starts at 9 a.m., with registration and breakfast starting at 8 a.m. On Tuesday, April 9th, the Polytechnic Institute of NYU will host us for morning sessions and lunch, with the afternoon free for lab tours or sightseeing. Tuesday evening, we will provide a closing dinner and boat cruise, so that you can see NYC's skyline, Statue of Liberty and other famous landmarks as the sun sets. Sessions at IIE on Wednesday morning focus on plans for the coming year, including a member-networking luncheon to explore joint bilateral projects.





Those wishing to meet with other IIE staff or learn more about IIE programs (Fulbright, Whitaker, Brazil Science Mobility Program, Research and Evaluation, Scholar Rescue Fund, IIENetwork, etc.) can schedule meetings on Wednesday afternoon or later in the week through us.

Transportation and Logistics

There are three major airports serving New York: John F. Kennedy and LaGuardia Airports (both in Queens, NYC) and Newark International Airport in New Jersey.

The international airports (JFK and Newark) are approximately 45 to one hour from midtown Manhattan, where IIE and the conference hotel are located. New York City is accessible through public transport from all airports, but it will require several transfers; there are more convenient and faster taxi services and shuttle vans that pick up from and drop off at hotels. Airport Shuttle buses (approx. \$25) take passengers from all three airports to Grand Central Station at 42nd St and Park Avenue, within walking distance of IIE and the conference hotel.
