Museum of Modern Art (MOMA)

Description: The Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) has been important in developing and collecting modernist art, and is often identified as the most influential museum of modern art in the world.

Admission includes special exhibitions, audio programs, films, & gallery talks.

Total Cost: Adults \$25



Visit the Top of the Rock and take an NBC Studio Tour at Rockefeller Plaza

Description: Tour NBC Network's most well-known studios, including The Today Show's Studio 1A, and the studio homes of the NBC Nightly News, Late Night with Jimmy Fallon, and Saturday Night Live. Then visit the "Top of the Rock" to see the magnificent views of Manhattan from the 70th floor observation deck at Rockefeller Center.

New York Public Library's Stephen A. Schwarzman Building Tour

Description: A Docent-led tour of The New York Public Library's Stephen A. Schwarzman Building. The Library offers tours of the building as well as exhibitions.

The New York Public Library is located at 42nd Street and Fifth Avenue

Staten Island Ferry

Description: The Staten Island Ferry is a passenger ferry service operated by the New York City Department of Transportation that runs between the boroughs of Manhattan and Staten Island.

Whitehall Terminal – Departure from Manhattan

Total Cost: Free



9/11 Memorial Center

The 9/11 Memorial, located in the heart of the World Trade Center, consists of two enormous reflecting pools set in the footprints of the Twin Towers. Each pool is approximately an acre in size, with 30-foot waterfalls cascading down all sides. Hundreds of white oak trees line the surrounding plaza. The names of 2,983 victims of the attacks of September 11, 2001 at the World Trade Center site, at the Pentagon and aboard Flight 93, as well as the World Trade Center bombing on February 26, 1993, are inscribed into bronze panels surrounding the pools.
