NTU – A Fast-rising University


- Ranked 47th in QS World University Rankings 2012/2013



NTU Engineering in QS World University Rankings 2013 by Subject



Singapore – East Meets West


- Founded by Sir Stamford Raffles in 1819 as a trading port (still a major income source today)










GERD* as % of GDP (Asian)





- To City: 20 mins (non-peak) at S\$32
- To NTU: 45 mins (non-Peak) at S\$36-S\$45
