

The opportunity to **pursue knowledge**





Outbound mobility at Melbourne

- Melbourne has the largest student mobility program in Australia - 2886 students in 2012 (17% increase from previous year)
- ➤ We sent 669 exchange students in 2012 & 745 in 2011 (↓)

But...

➢ Growth in short term meant that we sent in 2011 = 747 & 2012 = 1017 (↑)






Study Abroad at Melbourne (GE3)

Curriculum: Innovative curriculum, that lets students choose four subjects from any discipline area.

Hands-on: Gain credit for hands-on learning such as volunteering, research placements, and field work subjects.

Transcript: Receive a University of Melbourne transcript (your home institution is responsible for translating the grades)

Lease a property from a landlord or agent and share with friends.

Accommodation	Cost
Residential college	\$549–\$677 per week (includes meals,
	academic support and utilities)
Student apartment (single)	\$375 per week (rent only)
Student apartment (shared)	\$290 per week (rent only)
Private rental	\$183–\$207 per week (rent only)
